

VALE LEN DALRYMPLE

The Mont Albert Cricket Club were saddened to hear of the passing of Life Member Len Dalrymple.

Debuting in 1949, Len played 260 games for Mont Albert, making 3104 runs with a highest score of 80. As a wicket keeper, Len gathered 167 catches and a remarkable 97 stumpings. His ratio of stumpings to catches is the best recorded at MACC. He was awarded Life Membership by the club in 1967, the highest honour that is bestowed upon a member. Len was a committee member, vice president and also served as practice captain for many years.

Len's love for cricket was passed on to his three sons - Simon, Neil and Ian - each of who have had long standing involvement in cricket, both at Mont Albert and the Eastern Cricket Association.

Len's son Simon played in the first XI at MACC for more than 10 years and was a key member of our back-to-back Dunstan Shield premierships in 1997-98 and 1998-99.

His grandson Jai Dalrymple is a talented top order batsman and left arm spinner who became a 3rd generation MACC player and made his first XI debut last season.

Len will be greatly missed and fondly remembered.



SECRETARY'S REPORT

Ladies and Gentlemen,

Your Committee has much pleasure in submitting for your approval the 95th Annual Report and Statement of Receipts and Payments for season 2024/25.

A summary of the Club's achievements this past season follows:

On Field: Premiers Women's 1st team (B Grade), Veterans Purple (Over 50's Division 1), 3rd XI (E turf) Runners Up: 1st XI (Dunstan Shield), U14 Mixed 100 Semi Finalists – Veterans Gold, Veterans Red, U14B

Participation: A total of 207 players represented Mont Albert Cricket Club in season 2024/25.

Notably, the club entered its first ever Women's team which was a huge success. Led by Ellie Bonnett, our women came away with the B grade premiership in what was an outstanding first season in the competition. A huge thanks to Ellie who created an environment where women and girls of all ages felt welcome and included.

With huge contributions from Pete Guley, Wayne Hawkins and Ian Flowers, the team established a culture where players were encouraged to develop, grow and have fun. It was amazing to see a group of players who enjoyed each other's success and always played with huge smiles on their faces.

Some significant milestones were reached this season. Most notably, Luke Pich turned out for his 500th game for the club. Luke made his senior debut for MACC in season 1994/95, in a career that now spans 30 years with the club.

A mainstay of our one day and veteran's teams, Luke is a skilful bowler who boasts close to 300 wickets and also has a hat trick to his name. He was awarded life membership of the club in 2022 and his 500th game places him 2nd for games played in the club's history.

Allen Burton turned out for game number 400. Allen made his senior debut in season 1987/88 in a career that now spans almost 40 years. He boasts one of the best batting records in the club's history, amassing in excess of 9000 runs including 9 centuries and a highest score of 162. He has served on the committee, including a number of years as club treasurer and was awarded life membership of the club in 2017.

Our senior vice-captain James Guley played his 200th game for the club. A product of our junior program, James made his senior debut at a young age in season 2010-11 (while still a junior player). He progressed quickly through the grades and has established himself as a strong top order batsman, leg spin bowler and a terrific fieldsman for our first XI. He is a Dunstan Shield first XI premiership player in 2017/18 and a consistent performer at this level over many years.

At this year's Presentation Night, we welcomed 2 new Life Members of the Mont Albert Cricket Club in Colin Orchard and James Wright.

Colin commenced senior cricket at Mont Albert Cricket Club in season 2000/01 after also playing juniors for the club. In his 25 years of senior cricket, Colin has proven to be a great all-round cricketer, excelling in all facets of the game.

He is a 5-time premiership player including a Dunstan Shield premiership in 2012/13, as well as 4 consecutive second XI premierships between 2015-16 and 2018-19.

Colin is a terrific clubman and is the first to put his hand up to help in any capacity. He has coached our juniors, is first to help at a function or working bee and has probably done covers more than anyone at the club.

Jimmy commenced senior cricket at Mont Albert Cricket Club in season 1993-94 (while he was still a junior player) in a career that now spans more than 30 years with the club.

He has won 3 premierships in the 4th XI in season 2014-15, 2017-18 and again in 22-23 where he top scored in a run chase.

Jimmy's off field contribution is immense, being a key driver in the social functions at Mont Albert over many years. This has included being a leader in the club's involvement in the McGrath Foundation Ladies lunch and the Lift the Lid Walk for Mental Health.

In recent years, he has captained the veteran's Golds team and has generously hosted overseas players in his home.

Both Colin and James are very worthy recipients of life membership and in receiving their awards, it was great to hear their reflections on their time at the club and the role the cricket club has played in their lives.

Thank you to the committee, captains, coaches, team managers and volunteers for your efforts throughout the season.

Season 2024-25 saw us welcome a new club coach in Lucas Hutchinson. Hutchy was a welcome addition, providing technical and tactical guidance to players of all levels, as well as performing to a high level individually. Led by Andrew Padbury, our first XI once again finished on top of the ladder, but were unable to post a defendable total in the grand final, going down to Nth Balwyn for the second year in a row.

Jack Morley and Lachlan Fraser were selected in the Dunstan Shield team of the season in recognition of their outstanding seasons.

With premierships in our Women's first team, Veterans over 50s, as well as in our 3rd XI, we were able to achieve broad on field success for the club.

Our junior program continues to grow, with 9 teams once again entered across boys and girls competitions. A number of players were selected for representative cricket in the VMCU carnivals as well as in the Dowling Shield. A huge thanks to Darren Gleeson who coordinated the junior program, along with the coaches, team managers and parents who volunteered.

Our 'Woolworths Blasters' programs continued to be extremely popular on Friday nights. A big thank you to Jordan Dean who coordinated the program and ensured the kids (and parents) developed their skills and had a great time.

Marco Negri once again coordinated our veteran's program where we fielded 3 teams. All three teams made the semi-finals, with our over 50s 'Purples' going on to win the premiership at Mont Albert Reserve. Congratulations to all players involved.

Dan Bonnett, with support from many others, led another jammed pack social calendar which included a Sportsman's night to launch the season. A big thanks to Al Nicholson who was able to secure former Richmond champion Matthew Richardson and former Australian Test opener Chris Rogers as our special guests.

In addition to this event, we once again held the Melbourne Cup Calcutta, Christmas party, the Ladies Luncheon in support of the McGrath Foundation, a charity match for The Royal Children's hospital, the \$2000 draw, Movie nights, as well as junior and senior presentation nights.

Nell Nicholson was a welcome addition to the committee with her expertise in marketing and communication. You would have seen her handy work in the development of flyers and advertising for our social events and club milestones - Thank you Nell!

We once again welcomed a number of overseas players to Mont Albert this year. Jack Morley and Charlie Bennett were welcome additions to the first XI, both proving to be outstanding performers with bat and ball. Jack led the competition for wickets taking 35 scalps in Dunstan Shield and being selected in the team of the year.

Both players also made significant off field contributions, coaching our junior teams and contributing to their development. We would once again like to thanks James Wright and the Blair-Holts who generously opened their homes to accommodate Charlie and Jack.

Our volunteers are a huge strength of our club. Thanks as always go to our many volunteers, notably Jack Wright, Peter Knox, Richard Harding, Pete Guley, Wayne Hawkins, Ian Flowers, Rick Barker and Phil Woods who continue to help out without being asked and often without recognition.

Thanks to our first XI scorer Peter Coombs, our practice captain Tim Bonnett and to Kiel Johnsen in the role of Chairman of Selectors. There are many others who also contribute in many ways, so to all of our volunteers we thank you for your time and effort.

This year the G.G.Armstrong Trophy for Best Clubperson was shared with 3 individuals being recognised for their contribution across all aspects of the club.

TIM BONNETT has been our senior men's practice captain over many years. He rarely misses a training, ensuring everyone gets a bat and a bowl. He has scored for our women's first XI and is a long time contributor to the club.

DARREN GLEESON this year took on the role of junior coordinator. To coordinate 9 junior teams, coaches, team managers and players for training, games and functions is no mean feat, and we thank him greatly for his efforts this season.

ELLIE BONNETT led our women's team in their first year in the EGWC competition. She was integral in getting the team up and running, recruiting players and creating a culture where everyone felt welcome and included. The MACC women's MVP awards has been named in her honour.

Thank you to Aubrey Roga (President), Wayne Harris (treasurer) and the committee for your continued and ongoing hard work. Thank you to all of our sponsors for their generous support.

This year's Chris Dunning Trophy (Secretary's award for best report) required those submitting reports to use any two rhyming words in the same sentence. This year's winner for the most creative and contextual use is Ellie Bonnett who detailed the women's "great season for a reason".

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It's with great pride that I present our Annual Report for the Mont Albert Cricket Club's 2024–25 season — a season that marks our 95th year as a club and one that continued to build on the strong foundations of our rich history.

Now in my second year as President, the learning journey continues, but it has been made all the more rewarding thanks to the enduring support of our community and the legacy and culture established by those who came before me. In particular, I'd like to again acknowledge our past all the committee, plus key members and players, whose guidance continues to be a valued source of counsel and encouragement.

Performance on the Field

The 2024–25 season delivered another exciting chapter for MACC on the field. From juniors through to veterans, we saw spirited performances, memorable moments and importantly a new chapter open with our premiership winning senior women's team.

A huge congratulations to the following teams and individuals on their achievements:

EGWC Senior B Grade (Women's)

Mont Albert's Senior Women's team won the EGWC Senior B Grade Premiership. Led by captain Ellie Bonnett, the team included standout players like Alannah Dahlsen, Alexandra Allen, and Clare Fernandes

As the inaugural Senior Women's side representing MACC, this is a significant milestone for our club and community. Special thanks also go out to Peter Guley (coach), Wayne Hawkins (Assistant coach) & Ian Flowers (Team Manager) for their commitment in not only bringing to cohesiveness and organisation but ultimately a winning culture.

3rd XI Premiership - Charles Cohen Shield (E Turf)

Mont Albert's 3rd XI were crowned premiers in the Charles Cohen Shield (E Turf) competition for the 2024–25 season. This marks a significant achievement for the team and the club, continuing a tradition of strong performances across all senior grades.

Veterans Over 50s Division 1:

Mont Albert claimed the Over 50s Division 1 Grand Final title with a strong win over Lyndale.

- Pat Hawkins was named Player of the Match with 40 retired and 2/18.

Regular Season Excellence:

Mont Albert 1st XI finished top of the ladder in the Dunstan Shield competition, securing 10 wins from 14 matches and leading the league with a Net Run Rate of 1.429

Grand Final Heartbreak again:

Despite a dominant season, Mont Albert fell short in the Grand Final, losing to North Balwyn who chased down 116 runs to win by 5 wickets

- Captain Andrew Padbury and Ben Howes led a spirited bowling effort, with Padbury taking key wickets and Howes claiming two early breakthroughs.
- The team's bowlers performed admirably, but a lack of runs to defend proved decisive.

Leadership & Culture:

Captain Andrew Padbury & Lucas Hutchinson (1st year as senior coach) continued to exemplify leadership and sportsmanship, maintaining high standards and mentoring younger players throughout the season. I know they are already looking at ways for us to achieve the ultimate success.

Our Sunday XI, after last year's premiership, had a year out of the competition due to several factors, most notably the disruption caused by the loss of Elgar Park North West. We will make every effort to reinstate this team for the 2025-26 season.

Development and Growth

We remain firmly committed to our pathway programs and junior development. It's no exaggeration to say that our long-term sustainability depends on it.

The junior female program is now firmly cemented in our club and continues to go from strength to strength under the leadership of Chris Angus and Mark Agar. A personal highlight was again seeing our junior girls play a twilight turf match at Mont Albert Reserve — a sign of how far we've come in embracing inclusivity in our cricketing program.

We're also thrilled to share that this season marked the formation of our inaugural women's social team — an important milestone that we'll build on in future years.

Across our junior age groups, we're seeing a strong cohort transition into the senior ranks. It was particularly pleasing to see some new faces and early indications are this is set to grow again this season. We also had three juniors play Dowling Shield this year Jack Massey (Prahran CC – Captain), Sam Hawkins (MCC – Vice Captain) and Charlie Hester (SKCC – Vice Captain). A big congratulations to these MACC juniors who have got terrific cricketing journeys ahead of them.

Charlie Hester has received state honours by being selected for the Victorian U17 Squad and this follows on from Om Joshi representing Victoria U12 at the national carnival held in Adelaide last December.

Supporting these players development and ensuring they're provided the right opportunities will remain a key focus heading into next season, including selection structures that started this season. Thank you to Kiel Johnson, Phil Woods, Lucas Hutchinson and Andrew Padbury for their efforts in one of the most thankless undertakings in sport.

Community Engagement

Mont Albert Cricket Club has always been more than just cricket — and that was especially evident again this season. From Thursday night training and BBQs, to Friday night Blasters sessions, to the weekend banter, sausage sizzles, and post-game reflections — our club is alive with energy, conversation and connection. Once again, we welcomed two young Englishmen to Mont Albert. Both Charlie and Jack made invaluable contributions to our junior program, whilst being instrumental to the 1 st XI's on field success.

Lachie Fraser (510), Lucas Hutchinson (421) James Guley (387), Charlie Waite(318), Jack Woods (292) and Jack Morley (278) all had successful seasons with the bat. Lachie performed well when it mattered, playing a lone hand in the Grand Final with a wonderful half century.

Ultimately, despite us often having success with the bat in one day cricket, we must continue to find ways to succeed on a more consistent basis in 2-day cricket. Jack Morley (35), Andrew Padbury (28) and Ben Howes (17) led the bowling attack this season and were wonderfully supported by Angus Napier (12) and Charlie Bennet (12). Dan Bonnett, despite only taking 6 wickets, bowled some invaluable spells in white ball cricket, a real find for the 1 st XI.

Thank you to Aubrey and the committee for your unwavering support of the First XI. We are very lucky to play at a club where we want for nothing. To our volunteers, particularly the Thursday Night and Saturday crew's, led by the tireless Jack Wright, we cannot thank you enough. Your support of the club and us as a team is always noticed, always appreciated and always helps us to win games for Mont Albert.

To finish the Home & Away season with 10 wins, 4 losses and a top of the ladder was a fantastic achievement. For the second year in a row, we hosted a home Semi Final, this time against newly promoted Edinburgh. Having gone 1-1 with them in season, and with the eventual Dunstan Medallist their skipper, it was a dangerous match up.

Semi Final

Edinburgh batting first started in a watchful manner, with both openers struggling to score. Howes drew first blood with the score on 13, before Edinburgh dug in. The score meandered to 1-46 before the other opener fell to Morley. The key partnership, now at the crease did not last long. Guley took a good catch off Padbury at 1st slipand from then on it was one way traffic. From 1-46, Edinburgh lost 9-42 to be dismissed for 88 in 47 overs. Morley 4/23 and Bennett 3/29 did the damage.

This left Mont Albert with 30 overs to wrap things up within a day. The innings started with

both Woods and Fraser batting in a positive manner, before Woods was adjudged LBW. This brought Guley to the crease at 1-10 and from then on it was one way traffic. Both Mont Albert batters played beautifully to knock off the 89 required 1 down in just 23 overs. MACC were through to their second consecutive Grand Final.

Grand Final

For the second year in a row, Mont Albert welcomed North Balwyn to the Mont Albert Reserve for the Dunstan Shield Grand Final. Mont Albert finally won a toss and elected to bat in what felt like good batting conditions. Woods and Fraser once again started in a spritely fashion, before Woods was caught in the deep with the score at 1-22. This quickly became 2-25 before Charlie Waite joined Lachie Fraser at the crease. The pair put together a nice partnership against some excellent North Balwyn bowling, before Waitey fell. This triggered a collapse of 4-17, breaking the back of the MACC batting line up. Mont Albert were able to scrap to a well under par score of 115 thanks to some late order hitting from Howes.

North Balwyn's momentum continued at the beginning of their innings, with the openers getting off to a fast start. Morley bowled well and without luck, as he struck the pads of both batsmen. The momentum began to shift towards Mont Albert, with Howes and Morley applying pressure, before an incredible bit of work at short leg saw Woodsy nail a run out for the first wicket. This began a period of 8 overs of immense pressure on the North Balwyn batters. It felt like there was a strong appeal every over, alas nothing went the way of the home side. NB finished the day 1 down and despite losing 4 wickets the next week, were able to reach the 116 required with relative ease.

Despite a second consecutive Grand Final loss, there was plenty for MACC to be proud of. We showed real determination with the ball and in the field. The comradery within the group was evident for all to see, both on and off the field throughout the entire season. I have no doubt that this group will achieve the ultimate prize in the very near future.

In exciting post season new, both Lachie Fraser & Jack Morley were rewarded for their fantastic individual seasons with selection in the Dunstan Shield Team of the Season. Both lads demonstrated a high level of skill, complemented by their competitiveness and consistency and were thoroughly deserving of their selections.

THE SECOND XI

After bowling out Boronia for 136 (Tim Wright with another 3 fa), we were reeling at 9-112 in reply when Roy walked out to take his place with Orch. The pair put on 25 for the final wicket in trying conditions to bring home the win.

Whilst we rounded the first month with a respectable 2-2 win/loss, it got tough for the 2nd XI for the next stretch of five, losing all of the games to get to Christmas in deep trouble at 2 and 7. During the losses the performances were still relatively strong, Reg finding some form, Wright continuing to be vintage with the ball and most pleasingly the emergence of Nathan Woods as a genuine 2nd XI player. Nathan was used at the death in many of the one-dayers and was incredibly adept at the role.

With two one run losses in that stretch, us being in the bottom two and starting down the face of relegation, it would have been very easy for the boys to drop their heads and give up on the year. However this is where the story of the 2nd XI's season really began.

Coming back from Christmas we again ran into a red hot Surrey who were too strong with the bat getting to 230. However, in the first sign that the tide was turning we posted our highest score for the year to that point getting up to 197. Especially pleasing in this was the performances of Akein Madarasinghe and Joshua Dahlsen, two junior lads who really showed they belong at the level with scores of 32 and 29 respectively.

In what was the most remarkable batting innings of the season, Roy Taylor batting in the nosebleeds at no10 came out and hit an incredible 53 off only 32 balls (including six 6s) to get us up to a very defendable 177. We took two early ones on day 1 to ensure we won the day.

The second day we were again looking in trouble with Deepdene at 3-111 in reply, however in what was a theme of the season, we were never broken, and we rallied taking 6-26 to get them to 9-137. The 10th wicket partnership got dicey, however we found a way to win by 4 runs. With results going

our way even though we lost in round 14, the Deepdene game was the one that ensured we stayed up and summed up our year. Very good in patches and very poor in others, but ultimately with huge resilience and belief. Next year we will look to build on these themes and be more consistent between our best and worst.

WOMEN'S FIRST TEAM REPORT

Major change came to Mont Albert CC in 2024-25 with the development of the first senior women's team to represent the club.

It was an unusual start to the season as we didn't know if we'd have enough players to field a team and only a few of the 'girls' recruited had played competitive cricket previously.

So for the most part our players were new to cricket, new to training, new to the club and were obviously entering an unknown with no team having played before them.

What followed was truly phenomenal. It became a great season for a reason. The players quickly embraced each other, the club and the game. The outward joy shown in the players demeanour at games and at training hid a serious competitive streak.

We trained extremely hard and most players requested extra nights of training. Improvement was immediate – not just skill-wise but with our understanding of the game. We became a close-knit group both on and off the field team – enjoying several social nights at the club and enjoying great success on the field.

There had been several aims at the start of the season:

- To develop and integrate a competitive women's team into Mont Albert CC.
- Encourage participation from the many women and juniors who might have
- wanted to play but couldn't see a path at Mont Albert.
- To develop a culture of fun and competitiveness.
- To improve on-field and develop an A-Grade team as one of multiple women's
- teams.
- To provide and develop links between junior girl's competition and senior
- teams.

We feel we have made great inroads on all these aims. While the B-Grade premiership in the first year wasn't a specific goal, it does show that we are moving in the planned direction. We are achieving what we set out to do.

For 2025-26, the plan is to have an A-Grade team but we will need to grow numbers to around 18 players. A-grade plays every weekend and some players may not be available for all games – hence the increase in numbers required. Further, A-grade is an 11 player team, not 9 as we had in 24-25.

We also hope to adopt Mont Albert Reserve as our home ground. We have seen that the players love their new home and crowds attend when we're playing. This is great for the social side at MACC but more importantly we have seen that it attracts juniors to the ground. These juniors are already becoming a part of the broader team and can aspire to playing with the women in the near future.

The women's home ground concept can be achieved by requesting all women's home games to be played on alternate weeks to the Vet's competition. This would also develop the idea that there is cricket at MACC every single Sunday and supporters can come and enjoy the club environment. But that's for next year.

To finish off 2024-25, Mont Albert CC committee and the men's playing group need to be thanked for their outstanding support and friendship both on and off the ground. The measurable success shown in the first year could not have been achieved without entire club support - from the very first

planning meetings to the development of such a positive team culture. The players themselves pioneered their own culture of unqualified support for each other, along with a safe and non-judgmental environment to grow personally and as players.

This culture bodes well for attracting new players for next season and will be a launching pad for many years of successful women's cricket at Mont Albert CC.
